Still locked in and locked down, but making a difference.







My involvement with Rotary started when we were living in Hamilton in Western Victoria. Being the new Vice Principal in town I was interviewed by the local paper, The Spectator, then invited to speak at Hamilton North and Warrnambool Rotary Clubs.



I was appointment as Principal at Altona High School in the middle of 1994. Soon after my arrival at the school an old friend approached me about attending some Rotary lunches in Altona and eventually I was inducted into Altona Rotary in May 1997. It was this same friend that further encouraged me to experience the joy of riding eventually culminating in my first Ride To Conference (RTC) in 2000 to Sydney. This friend is John Boyle. John's first RTC was to Adelaide the year before.

Our participation in subsequent RTC's provided us with the opportunity to raise funds for a range of charities including: The Royal Children's Hospital Neonatal and Cardiology Units, the Alfred Hospital Burns Unit, MS Victoria. We have ridden to a variety of destinations including: Sydney, Adelaide, Shepparton, Mt Buller, Bendigo, around Tasmania and Sydney to the Gold Coast. The destination is determined by where the Annual District Conference is being held.

On several occasions we have also had the pleasure of including Rotary Exchange students from USA, Germany, Argentina, Brazil.

It was also around this time that Phil and Barb Purdy from Western Truck became involved and were Repairs great supporters of the ride. Phil is also a Past President of Werribee Rotary. Yvonne's passion commitment inspired the and organising committees such that every ride since 2008 has been in support of RoCan. The Committee is committed to organise at least another 2 rides for RoCan. Hopefully the next one will be 2021.
